### New Business WLF

17.

WLF Director Ken Wallender reported that the cabin project is complete at a cost of \$2.1 Million with \$2,000 of landscaping to be done yet. Program Associate has one date left, which is August 2nd, 2001. April will be a training session for the Quest program. Cost will be \$225 per teacher with the remainder being paid by the Foundation. DiabetesCamp will run for 2 weeks next year, due to the great attendance. Many kids were unable to participate because of the overwhelming attendance. The new program received many checks from various organizations, but the registered youth did not show for unknown reasons. Factors are believed to be due to the low cost of sponsors' registration investment. Letters will be sent out to staff and clubs, suggesting they follow-up to ensure each youth sponsored, attends the program. This will help to ensure that youth wishing to attend, will be able to do so; while maintaining a full attendance. PDG Steve Groene and Ken Wallender delivered 290 lbs. of cheese on July 27th, donated by Sergento Cheese for Diabetes Kids. The golf outing had 168 register, and 160 showed. Lions Day had 1,200 reservations at the time of deadline, and 1,150 showed. Due to the threat of inclement weather, many guests left early. Ken Wallender has 4-seasons pins available if needed. The Storage Building has been completed. Ground breaking for Eye Glass Center took place at Lions Day. Among the 7 motorcycle clubs, a donation of \$35,000 was received for the Climbing Wall. The last addition on the Climbing Wall has been completed. The wall is also handicap accessible. From the Dining Hall to first cabin in the boy's section, a loft break has been added. Upcoming improvements include: addition to the Health Lodge, addition to the Dining Hall, (a meeting with the architect will be addressing committee's concerns), Kate and Owl will include an

amphitheater with seating into the North bank, doors will be added to the Rec Shelter, install a sprinkler system for the lawns. Lawyer attends each year from Milwaukee and teaches tennis, suggested building tennis courts for the kids. Any donations of tennis rackets and tennis balls are to be given to Ken Wallender. The grant for the Animal Pans and Feeding Station has been lost. The Feeding Station will be placed at the loft way behind the Memorial Building to help attract wild animals to that area. Eye glasses and hearing aides are needed, with an emphasis on hearing aides. There were aproxiamately 61,000 pairs of eye glasses received on Lions Day. Conference of Camp will be held October 16th - 20th. Work Day is scheduled for October 20th, November 10th, April 6th, and April 13th at the camp. Ken Roberts was recognized for his donation during the past 7 years to the WLF. WLF Director Dave Wood had the opportunity to attend two director meetings before he started official business. He sits on three committees. Any questions or concerns can be directed to Dave and he will bring them to the board.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES**

Back in 1972 the International Association of Lions adopted a policy statement that regarding human environment. This statement in part stated that the Association would "...foster and promote then general welfare; to help create and maintain conditions under which man and nature can exist in productive harmony and fulfill the social, economic and other requirements of present and future generations of mankind." Needless to say this is an important policy, so our district cabinet had a post for a number of years as Environmental Chair. This year I am this chair.

In a UN system-wide Environmental Issues on consumption, the report discusses ways that we can change our lifestyles to make a significant moderation of consumption of our resources. It goes on to give some facts: People in industrial countries account for 20% of world population, but consume 85% of its aluminum, 81% of its paper, 80% of its iron and steel, and 76% of its timber. The average American citizen accounts for the use of 540 tones of construction materials, 18 tons of paper, 23 tons of wood, 16 tones of metals and 32 tones of organic chemicals in the course of a lifetime. In the US, total consumption of virgin raw materials was 17 times greater in 1989 that in 1900, compared with a threefold increase in population.

To change this drain of our natural resources, industry must change their mentality and so do we as individuals. We must think of environmentally efficient materials. Getting rid of waste is of course a costly problem, subsidized by local, state and national funding. Maybe if the cost gets high enough we will learn. Maybe our Lions Clubs on the local level should do more to try to bring our consumption down to sustainable levels. Let's not continue to think about waste disposal, rather think about waste reduction.



- Diabetes is a leading cause of blindness.
   Diabetics are 25 times more prone to blindness.
- Diabetics are 17 times more prone to kidney disease, 5 times more prone to gangrene (often leading to amputation) and twice as prone to heart disease and stroke.
- Diabetes decreases life expectancy by approximately one-third.
- The incidence of diabetes appears to be increasing by 6% annually.
- 50% of diabetics don't know they have the disease.
- There are two types of diabetes insulin dependent and non insulin dependent.




Hello Everyone:



World-wide, recent data shows:


- 45 million people are blind (vision less than 20/400).
- **№** 180 million people have vision impairment (vision less than 20/60).
- 1 person becomes blind every 5 seconds.
- 1 child becomes blind every minute.

- About 45,000 transplants are performed each year using corneas donated in the United States.






When the cornea (the eye's front 'windowpane') becomes cloudy, light cannot penetrate the eye to reach the light-sensitive retina. Poor vision or total blindness may result.


### CORNEAL TRANSPLANT



Cloudy cornea is removed with a cylindrical cutting instrument called a trephine. Same trephine cuts out donor cornea so shapes are identical.




Clear donor cornea is placed in the opening.




Donor cornea is sewn in place.

If the graft is successful, light may be focused onto the retina in a normal fashlon. Optical signals are channeled to the brain via the optic nerve and sight is restored.



Wisconsin patients receive the best corneas available for transplant as needed. Additional corneas are provided to other eye banks in the United States and to foreign programs. 90% of the blindness in the world is in foreign under-developed countries with severe financial hardships.

The Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin has expenses of about \$1.4 million per year. Testing for infectious disease and suitability of the donor cornea is expensive but necessary to ensure safety and success of the transplant. Last year \$125,000 was donated to assist the eye bank. This provided many free transplants to people in need.

959 corneal transplants were performed with corneas donated by Wisconsin residents. Also, eyes donated for research and educational uses were provided to the University of Wisconsin Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences (Madison) and to the Medical College of Wisconsin's Department of Ophthalmology (Milwaukee).

Research programs investigate glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy, and macular degeneration and may someday yield treatments or methods of prevention. Eyes were also provided for training of new ophthalmic surgeons also ensuring their skills and competency are among the highest levels.

Wisconsin is a leading state in the donation of organs, eyes, and tissues for transplant. Your support of the eye bank allows us to continue that accomplishment while at the same time helping all those in need of the *Gift of Sight*.

### **Environmental Article**

From your Environmental Chair, Tom Koch, PDG:

Air pollution kills up to 3 million people annually. Ninety percent of these are in the developing world. Outdoor pollution harms more than 1.1 billion people and kills an estimated half million people per year, mostly in cities. Much of this is due to traffic.

Indoor air pollution—soot from burning wood, dung, crop residues and coal for cooking and heating affects 2.5 billion people, mostly women and girls, and is estimated to kill more than 2.2 million people each year. These statistics come from the World Population News Service Popline.

Some other environmental issues include that deforestation rates are highest in history. Half of the world's forests have disappeared since the end of the last Ice Age. As global populations increases, this seems to be a growing concern. According the the United Nations Population Report, the decline in forests is due to both, increasing population and the decreasing forest area. Of course, the greatest problem is in areas of Asia, Africa and Latin America. However, it is all of our concern. Just think of the repercussions of this.

Finally, consumption is a critical factor in the relationship between population and environmental stress per the 2001 State of World Population Report by the U.N. Population Fund. Almost all human activities put demands on natural recources. Currently, a huge consumption gap exists globally. The 20 percent of the world's people who live in the highest income countries, like the U.S. account for 86 percent of total private consumption expenditures, while the poorest 20 percent, account for just 1.3 percent. Similarly, today one-fifth of the world's population that live in industrialized countries produce over one-half of the carbon dioxide emitted into the atmosphere, while the poorest one-fifth produce only 3 percent. The U.S. alone, with only 4.6 percent of global population, emits nearly 25 percent of global greenhouse gases. Again, think of the effects on us!

### PUBLIC RELATIONS—WHAT, WHY, HOW?

WHAT: Public Relations is the art of building a positive image of YOUR Lion's club. The International Association of Lions Clubs is promoting Lionism through major media centers worldwide. However, ensuring positive public awareness is still the work of Lions at the local level.

WHY: Good Public Relations on the local level can bring support for our activities and strengthen our membership growth. People may be impressed with how Lions worldwide are responding to human needs, but they want to know specifically what the local Lions Club is doing for **their** community; how Lions are improving the quality of *their* lives.

HOW: All Lions are important to their club's public image. Our actions and demeanor must reflect our commitment to the ideals of Lionism, in our everyday lives, as well as during special projects and events. We must be knowledgeable about Lionism and use this knowledge to show others that it is "Great To Be A Lion." Lion's International has a wealth of information available to help clubs explain "who Lions are and what they do."

Sharing our accomplishments with others is also an important part of Public Relations. We can keep our fellow Lions informed through a club newsletter, the District Governor's newsletter and web site (www.fdl.uwd.edu/27-b1), the WISCONSIN magazine, and the INTERNATIONAL LIONS magazine. The public can be made aware of Lion events through news releases to area newspapers, radio and television public service announcements, informational material placed in public places (include your newsletter), and by simply spreading the word to co-workers and friends.

When preparing a news release for the local papers, ask, "Would a non-Lion be interested in this?" For articles to be newsworthy they should be about timely activities that enhance your local community, involve the general public, perform a public service, or involve local personnel. Type the release double-spaced on one or two pages; keep paragraphs and sentences short and concise. Be sure to include a contact name and phone number in the upper right-hand corner.

A picture can make your news release more effective. It must, however, be taken with thought, creative composition and care. Simplicity is the key to good photos. Get action into your picture. A photo of someone using the equipment you purchased, or being served by your project, is far more effective than somebody presenting a check or shaking hands. Give your picture Lion identification (wear Lion vest or cap; have your banner in the background).

Newspaper articles should be submitted directly to the Editor of your local paper(s). Articles for the WISCONSIN or The LION may be sent directly to them or be submitted through your District PR Chairman, Cora Lawson, N5747 Metovale Rd. Brandon, 53919. Your District PR Chairman is also available to present information on Public Relations at Zone or Club meetings (920) 346-5501; e-mail: coraml@centurytel.net

### "DON'T FORGET YOUR CHANGE!"

I first remember hearing this phrase when I was a kid after my father dug into his pocket to give me a dollar. I was then well on my way to making my first purchase. I don't quite remember what my purchase was going to be, but it was undoubtedly, a soda, some ice cream, or a candy bar. Back in the old days the items mentioned didn't cost more than a dollar and therefore, my father used the phrase "DON"T FORGET YOUR CHANGE!". As you read on, the word CHANGE will take on one of Mr. Webster's different meanings.

CHANGE is a password for human survival. Without change, life becomes stale, predictable, and lacking in surprises. We tend to think of CHANGE in terms of outside forces that can offer variety in our lives - a change in jobs or houses. Surely you have heard someone remark, You know, everything is different, but nothing has changed!" Right! Many people are still discovering that alterations in outside factors such as employment settings or living locations do not always guarantee the change they wanted. Consider the people who have difficulty keeping their jobs, perhaps because of an attitude problem. A switch in cities by itself will make a difference, but not necessarily a change.

Real **change** does not occur by switching to a different environment. It comes from within. For things around us to **change**, we need to **change**. In order for things to get better for us, we need to get better. In order for things to get better for us, we need to get better. We're the ones who need to become different, not our surroundings so "DON"T FORGET YOUR CHANGE!"

I would like to thank those of your who have gone out and sponsored a new member this year. I commend you for approaching someone and asking if they would like to be a Lion. I feel this is the best compliment that you could ever give someone. District 9x9 averages twelve new members a month, which figures to 144 a year. This figure doesn't sound too bad! It is the drops on the bottom line of the membership form, where our new member gain evaporates each month. Our poor retention is causing us to have more former Lions out there than we have Lions. It is a known fact that if our clubs are not growing, we need to assume that they are dying. I therefore recommend that you "DON'T FORGET YOUR CHANGE!"

I have a vision of what new members go through after joining a Lions club. That is they get on our Lion train right behind the engine, and then they start walking the length of the train going through one car after another. Oh, there are plenty of seats on the train, but they fail to sit down. They don't see, hear or feel anything they want to be associated with. When they reach the end of the train they jump off and become a former Lion.

Let's say the first car was overloaded with lengthy boring meetings. Maybe the second car was full of club politics and cliques, and the third car was loaded with the lack of involvement for new members. These are three of the biggest reasons why our new members drop. And you know what! They are controlled by each one of us in our individual clubs. With **HELP** being the key word, this is where we need to **change**.

# Requirements for 100% Treasurer's Award

- 1. Must have kept accurate records and presented reports of the club's financial condition to the club in a timely fashion.
- 2. Must have paid the semi-annual state and district dues by October 1 and April 1.
- 3. Must have paid all International dues within 30 days of receipt of billing.
- 4. There must be no club indebtedness owed to Lions International or the district which would make club delegates ineligible to vote at either the district, state or international conventions.

- 6. The club treasurer must be recommended for this award by the president with final approval by the district governor.
- 7. Any of the above criteria may be waived by the district governor is he is advised of conditions which exist beyond the control of the treasurer.
- 8. Application for this award must be submitted to the district governor, from the club president, no later than 30 days following the close of the International Convention in Indianapolis, which is July 6th.

# Requirements for 100% Secretrary's Award

- 1. All membership reports must be mailed in sufficient time in order to reach Lions International by the 10th of the following month.
- 2. All district/state and international dues and all club supply billing be given to the treasurer for payment.
- 3. There must be no club indebtedness owed to Lions International or the district which would make club delegates ineligible to vote at either the district, state or international conventions.
- 4. The PU-101 form must be properly filled out showing the newly elected president, secretary and treasurer and must be completed as required and submitted no later than April 30 to Lions International and the District Governor.
- 5. All delegate forms and cards must be completed and submitted to the State Office by May 1 for the state convention.
- The secretary must have attended at least two zone meetings.
- 7. The secretary must have attended either the district officer training seminar in April 2001 or attended the district convention last October in Manitowoc.
- 8. The club secretary must be recommended for this award by the president and the zone chairman with the final approval by the district governor.
- 9. Any of the above criteria may be waived by the district governor if he is advised of conditions which exist beyond the control of the secretary.
- 10. All membership reports must be mailed in sufficient time in order to reach Lions International by the 10th of the following month.
