The prayer was led by Chaplain Earl Buchholz. The Pledge of Allegiance to the flag was led by IPDG Dennis Kitchen. A song was led by Song Leader Earl Buchholz. After the introduction of cabinet members committee members, guests and wives, the Deputy District Governors and Zone Chairmen were inducted into their respective offices and as members of the District Cabinet by District Governor Habrat. Pins were distributed to Lioness June Kitchen and Lioness Renee Seiler as cabinet members. The ladies were excused from the meeting after a welcome was extended to all by District Governor Habrat.

The Cabinet Secretary acknowledged the communications received from the cabinet members not in attendance. IPDG Kitchen presented 28 100% Secretary Awards for 1986-1987 to the Deputy District Governors for distribution in their regions. The final financial report for the 1986-1987 District Cabinet was presented by IPDG Kitchen along with the audit report from Geoffrey Sawtelle of the Farmers Exchange Bank, Meshkoro, Wisconsin. A motion was made by Charles Pommerening DDG to accept the final financial report of the 1986-1987 District Cabinet and seconded by James Hildreth ZC. The motion carried. IPDG Kitchen thanked the cabinet for their support during his year as District Governor.

The proposed budget for 1987-1988 was presented by the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer. Following an explanation and discussion, Victor Voigt DDG made a motion to accept the 1987-1988 budget as presented. The motion was seconded by Paul Tadych DDG and was carried. The Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer proposed that the Associated Meenah West Bank be the depository for district funds this year. Dennis Kitchen IPDG made a motion to approve the Associated Meenah West Bank as the District bank for the year. Seconded by Gary Williams DDG and the motion carried. The semi-annual billing of dues was presented by the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer. Gary Williams DDG made a motion to accept both semi-annual billings for 1987-1988 as presented. Seconded by Harold Sippel ZC. The motion was carried. Additional information will be included in the District Governor's newsletter about the billing information.

OLD BUSINESS:

PDG Tom Koch presented the proposed constitutional bylaw addition for the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award program. This program is for undesignated LCIF funds contributed to the district. This addition was turned over to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee to draw up the resolution for voting at the District Convention.

Lion Gordon Hoffman presented the convention guidelines as drafted by the Convention Guidelines Committee. These guidelines will be used for district conventions and specify requirements. It is necessary to add statements indicating what expenses the host club is responsible for and what expenses are the responsibility of the district. The rough draft of this resolution is to be submitted to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee by September 1, 1987 so it can be on the ballot at the next District Convention.

IPDG Kitchen asked if there were any questions or concerns about the past State Convention and there weren't any. He then asked Lion Tom Clausen from the Fond du Lac Evening Lions Club to explain the arrangements for the upcoming District Convention. This convention will be at the Holiday Inn, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin on October 30, 31 and November 1, 1987. There will be a \$2.00 registration fee for each Lion and \$1.00 fee for a Lioness, wife or guest. The Saturday luncheon will cost \$7.50 and the Saturday banquet (beef and pork family style) will cost \$12.00. After October 15, 1987 the cost of each meal will increase \$.50. Registrations submitted before October 15, 1987 will be included in a \$50.00 raffle to encourage early registration. Entertainment for Friday night is being arranged. There will be donuts for the first 250 people on Saturday morning. The Saturday night entertainment will be a sock hop with a disc jockey. Registration forms and booklet ad information will be sent to all clubs in the district. The speaker will be International Director Howard Conroy from New York. A tour of the camp is being planned for Director Conroy on Friday. Irv Korth ZC made a motion to allow a raffle by the Fond du Lac Evening Lions Club at the District Convention. This was seconded by James Hildreth ZC and the motion carried. Lion Irv Korth ZC made a motion to permit the Fond du Lac Evening Lions Club to send a mailing to all clubs in the district and to cabinet members regarding the convention and the raffle. This was seconded by Robert Showers ZC. The motion carried. There will be a cabinet meeting at 11:00 a.m., November 1, 1987 after the brunch at the Holiday Inn, Fond du Lac. The district will pay for the cabinet members brunch. An addition to the agenda of the District Convention this year will be a necrology service on Saturday, October 31, 1987 for the Lions who died this past year. Zone Chairmen were asked to send the names of all Lions and Lionesses who died this past year to the Cabinet.

Secretary-Treasurer. A representative from the club of each deceased person should be present at this service. There will be a general business session in the morning of October 31, 1987 and the seminars will be in the afternoon. Balloting will occur after the seminars. Credential forms will be sent to all clubs.

The elections to be held at the District Convention will include the election of the next District Governor, selection of a convention host city, selection of a bowling city and action on resolutions. The only candidate of District Governor at this time is DDG Paul Tedych who addressed the Cabinet. He will take a one year leave of absence from his job for the year he is District Governor. The only city expressing interest in hosting the District Convention is Sheboygan. President John Sonnenburg from the Sheboygan Noon Lions Club addressed the Cabinet and presented information on the facilities at Sheboygan and asked for our support in their hosting the convention November 4-6, 1988. A mailing will be sent to all clubs before this year's convention. Elkhart Lake has withdrawn their request to host the convention because the hotel will not be available. District Governor thanked them for considering this matter. No presentations were made for bowling but several clubs are interested and bids will be sent to Chairman Harder. Resolutions to be voted on will be to update our constitution to reflect the change in the International constitution regarding male/female, the convention guidelines and the Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards program. There was discussion regarding the mailing of cabinet meeting minutes within 10 days after the meeting and having the first cabinet meeting within 30 days after the International Convention. These subject will be researched and discussed with International Director Reimer Levy.

NEW BUSINESS:

District Governor Habrat reported on changes at International. There is a new policy for an automatic status quo for clubs with past due accounts after a certain period. Once in a status quo the payment of the past due amount will not remove the status quo. Regular procedures must be followed. The increase in fees for new charter members, the transfer fee to a new charter club and the new member fee were published in the July issue of the "LION". The extension representatives are being terminated and their duties will fall back on the districts. The details for LMI's program have not been received from International yet. The state budget is being worked on, as are the final reports from last year. The state office secretary expense will be the full responsibility of the multiple district and the Wisconsin Lions Foundation after this year. The State Secretary is terminating as of December 31, 1987 so a new State Secretary will be needed.

We are waiting to hear from Profit Masters, Inc. so we can approve the program for this year. Lion Victor Voigt DDG made a motion that we continue the Profit Masters program and look into receiving money from the popcorn sales. The motion was seconded by Charles Pommerening DDG and was carried.

The Lions World Service Day is in October and October is Membership month. Zone Chairmen were asked to remind their clubs of these events. DDG Milton Wood asked if a Lionsess can submit a design for the District Pin and was answered in the affirmative.

The committee chairman present gave their reports. Most committees are must getting organized for the year. District Pin Chairman Roy Kushn has no pin entries at this time. Drug Awareness Chairman John Darrow reported that there were four workshops in Wisconsin in 1987. The number of schools in the state involved in the quest program increased from 65 to 93. He has goals for this year to get more schools in our district involved. Historian DDG Orv Doede is continuing to gather information and will have a display at the District Convention. Hearing and Speech Chairman Gordon Hoffman reported that the Packwaukee Lionsess Club gave \$3,000 to the Hearing Dog program. LCIF Chairman DDG Tom Koch said clubs should set their goals high for contributions to this program based on International President Stevenson's program. Leader Dog Chairman DDG Glenn Murty reported that 14 clubs did not contribute to this program last year and wants 100% participation this year. The average cost of a dog will increase from \$8,250 to \$8,500.

Environmental Chairman DDG Fred Holtz stated that clubs should get involved in the collection of glass containers, tin cans and paper as the land fill sites are getting full. Leadership and indoctrination Chairman DDG Don Kruegel stated we should get some of our former members back into the clubs. Also get more Lions involved in the Train the trainer program as we need trainers. He wants to get the new orientation program to every club. Extension Chairman for Regions 1 & 2 Jim Seltzer reported that a Francis Creek Lionsess Club is being formed. Extension Chairman for Regions 3 & 4 IPDG Kitchen reported that the Winneconne Lions Club charter night is October 17, 1987. An Omro Lionsess club is being investigated and a North Fond du Lac Lions club is being looked at. Sight Conservation Chairman DDG Orv Doede stated that eye bank meetings will be reinstated and he is requesting the names of each club's sight conservation chairman. The used eyeglass program is continuing. WLF Directors DDG Herb Schneider and DDG Milton Wood reported on their activities and on the success of the Lions Day at the camp. Youth Exchange Chairman Ray Vodach had information in the

District Governor's newsletter and would like to attend zone meetings to provide information on this program.

The Deputy District Governors and Zone Chairmen reported on the activities in the clubs in their areas.

Lion James Hildreth ZC made a motion to adjourn which was seconded by Lion Irv Korth ZC. The motion was carried and the meeting adjourned at 5:35 p.m.

Chaplain Earl Buchholz gave the opening prayer which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Song Leader Earl Buchholz led the singing of "God Bless America". Following roll call District Governor Habrat introduced International Director Helmer Leicy and Past District Governor Harry Merriman. The only communications read by the secretary were from the cabinet members not in attendance.

Zone Chairman Korth made a motion to accept the minutes of the August 23, 1987 cabinet meeting as printed. The motion was seconded by DDG Pommerening and was passed. The financial report for the first quarter was presented by the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer. Following discussion DDG Voigt made a motion to approve the financial report as printed which was seconded by ZC Hautamaki. The motion was adopted. The only club which has not paid their semi-annual dues is Harrisville. Contact has been made by the Zone Chairman, Deputy District Governor and the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer. The charter of the Brandon Lions Club has been recaptured. State dues were not paid for the Brandon Club even though we were billed for them. State Council is developing a policy for status quo clubs.

PDG Veller reported for the Long Range Planning Committee. This committee is looking at redistricting and requested input from the district. Let him know in writing what we want done in our district. All thoughts and recommendations would be appreciated.

District Governor Habrat, DDG Tadych and the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer reported on the USA/Canada Forum held in Kansas City, MO September 17-20, 1987. It was suggested that incoming club officers and cabinet members would benefit greatly from attendance at the forum. The 1988 Forum will be in Niagara Falls, NY September 22-25, 1988. Information will be included in the District Governor's Newsletter as it is received.

OLD BUSINESS:

Monthly meetings are being held in Oshkosh for the State Convention. DDG Pommerening reported that the Oshkosh hotels are full and now dormitories and motels outside Oshkosh are being used. The Past District Governors are responsible for the seminars at the convention. The International Convention will be in Denver and early registrations are needed to insure delegates will be housed in the Wisconsin headquarters hotel. All the remarks regarding the just completed District Convention were positive. The host club did an outstanding job and the facilities fulfilled all the requirements of the convention. The seminars were all well received and acknowledgments will be sent to the presenters. It was suggested that future seminars include attorneys who can discuss legal and liability questions. It was also suggested that seminars topics and times be published earlier so delegates can schedule their attendance.

Profit Masters Inc. had a display during the convention. A contract will be signed for the year so we endorse that company only. Summer activity will be included in the funds sent to us. The District Governor's newsletter will include information about Profit Masters so additional clubs will become involved. The district receives 10¢ per color book in March and \$5.00 per case of mints every two months. The clubs should notify the District Governor or Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer of the merchandise they purchase so we know what credit we should receive.

Zone Chairman were reminded to inform their clubs to report all World Lions Service Day activities so we know what clubs participated and what the activity was so other clubs can get ideas. It appears that October Membership month was successful from the numbers being reported on the October M & A reports. Flyers for the January, February and March membership drive will be distributed in January.

NEW BUSINESS:

An extension award was presented to Lioness Associate Renee Seiler. The clubs accounts as of September 30, 1987 which were over sixty days old were identified by the District Governor. After 90 days the clubs are notified that they are subject to being put in status quo.

International Director Leicy reported on things occurring at International and on a state level. The International Convention will have a food fair after the parade on Wednesday, activities at Mile High Stadium on Thursday night, International night on Friday will feature Stars on Ice and there will be a

Country Western breakfast on Saturday. Discussion is taking place regarding the change of the Deputy District Governor title to Region Chairman. The Lt. Governor position is also being studied. The portion of the salary of the state office secretary presently being paid by Lions International will be picked up by the Wisconsin Lions next July. The state secretary position will not be filled until the February Council meeting. An award was presented to the Wisconsin Lions by The Association of Wisconsin School Administrators last Thursday in Milwaukee for the work done and contributions to schools and communities. Director Lucy responded to the question regarding the International office sending out forms 990 to each club by saying that the state office is investigating the possibility of them sending out this form. Presently this form can be requested from the IRS or the state office. This form is due November 15.

The District Governor's Summary Report, 1987-88 was distributed to Deputy District Governors, Zone Chairman and Committee Chairman so that the information needed can be accumulated during the year. It should be turned in at the April Cabinet meeting so that the District Governor can have it completed by the June 1 due date. The Weak Club status reports from Zone Chairman were due September 30, 1987 and the District Governor has only received a couple so far. Every Zone Chairman should submit the form even if there are no weak clubs. Zone Chairman visitation reports should be sent to the District Governor as soon as possible.

The committee reports were given by the committee chairmen. PDG Koch requested the District Governor appoint the Melvin Jones committee so that recipients can be selected. Club contributions to LCIF need to be increased. A 20 minute film on LCIF is available. There were 8 new Melvin Jones fellows in the District last year. No report from Constitution and By-laws except that the three resolutions passed at the convention. Diabetes Chairman Kuester reported that the American Diabetes Association provided an outstanding seminar and programs are available to the clubs. Bowling Chairman Harder reported that the District Bowling tournament was completed and that PDG Murty is the new State Bowling Secretary. Fin Chairman Kuehn reported that ZC Del Peterson designed the winning district pin. ZC Korth made a motion that a \$50 savings bond be purchased for the winner, seconded by ZC Sippel and the motion passed. The pin design will be sent to five manufacturers requesting samples and quotations. The same procedures will be used as in previous years.

District Elections Chairman Riess reported that of the 314 eligible delegates, 208 registered, 162 were certified and 151 voted. Our B-1 chairman is also the Chairman of the State Elections Committee. Drug Awareness Chairman Danrow reported he has presented two programs and has four more scheduled. Hearing and Speech Chairman reported that \$3,050 has been received so far this year. Historian Doede reported he is still getting information and he had a display at the convention. Leader Dog Chairman Murty reported that there was good attendance at the seminars. Last year \$100,000 was contributed to Leader Dog School and 18 dogs were received. Leo Chairman Binder stated that is program needs some attention. Extension Chairman 1 & 2 Sailer reported that Francis Creek is trying to increase their membership. There should be a new Lioness

club after January 1. Extension Chairman 3 & 4 and PDG Kitchen reported that the seminars were well attended and a Lioness district was discussed. Omro Lioness were chartered in September. North Fond du Lac will be contacted about forming a club. Membership Development and Retention Chairman Harrington stated that clubs should get all members involved in order to retain them. Public Relations Chairman Cecil stated that when information is sent to him be sure it is complete. Sight Conservation Chairman Doede reported good presentations were made at the seminars. Eye banks are doing good and donations continue to increase. The Wisconsin Lions Foundation Directors Wood and Schneider reported that 35 clubs have contributed this year so far. They were \$20,000 short this year in operating funds. Placemats and eyeglasses collection boxes are available. Youth Exchange Chairman Wodach will visit zone meetings when requested. A contribution of 50¢ per member would help their program.

The Deputy District Governors and Zone Chairman gave their reports on clubs in their zones and regions. The past activities and planned activities for the coming months were announced. The Valdars Viking ship will be in the International Parade in Denver.

Past District Governor Harry Merriman complemented the district on their good convention. If anyone is interested in running for District Governor he suggested attendance at the USA/Canada Forum where a large quantity of information is available. We have a goal of 200 delegates at the International Convention in Denver.

The next cabinet meeting will be Sunday, January 17, 1988 at 1:00 p.m. with District 27 B2 at the Rock Garden in Green Bay. A snow alert plan will be included with the meeting notice so that everyone can be notified if the meeting is cancelled due to the weather. The plan is to have the District Governor and/or Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer call the Deputy District Governors who will call their Zone Chairmen. The Zone Chairmen will call the Committee Chairmen in their areas. The fourth cabinet meeting will be in Region 4 with a tentative date of April 17, 1988.

The closing prayer was given by Chaplain Buchholz. The meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

Prior to the cabinet meeting being called to order, the Cabinets of Districts 27B-1 and 27B-2 were welcomed by District Governor Donald Sykes of 27B-2. Contributions totaling \$37.65 were collected from cabinet members and forwarded to the Wisconsin Lions Foundation as a memorial for Mrs. Norma Sturm.

Zone Chairman Knux made a motion to accept the minutes of the November 1, 1987 cabinet meeting as printed. The motion was seconded by DDG Tadych and was passed. The financial report for the period from July 1, 1987 to January 16, 1988 was presented by the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer. DDG Voigt made a motion to approve the financial report as printed which was seconded by ZC Champeau. Following discussion regarding convention expenses, office expense and Profit Master, Inc. the motion was called and passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

DDG Pommerening reported on the planning for the State Convention in Oshkosh on May 19, 20 and 21, 1988. The district luncheon will be held at Butch's Anchor Inn. Room reservations are now being made at motels outside of Oshkosh. Information on motels in the surrounding cities will be included in the District Governor's newsletter if it is sent to him. There are two campgrounds available and further information will be printed in the state magazine. Tickets for the opening banquet will be provided for cabinet members by the District. Cabinet members in attendance completed a sign-up sheet requesting tickets. All other cabinet members are to send their request to the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer no later than March 31, 1988 so the tickets can be obtained and distributed at the April 17, 1988 cabinet meeting. IPDG Kitchen reported that the Sheboygan Moon Lions are working on the next District Convention which will be held November 4, 5 and 6, 1988. Anyone planning to attend the next International Convention in Denver should get their room reservations in immediately in order to get rooms in the Wisconsin hotel. The cost of the Wisconsin breakfast will be \$8.00. The next issue of the State magazine will have information on transportation to the convention.

District Governor Habrat presented a report on Profit Masters Inc. which he received by telephone last week. Activity since July 1, 1987 will provide the District with \$225.00 from mints (17 clubs), \$141.60 from coloring books (6 clubs) and \$31.35 from popcorn. A check for the mints will be coming soon. The coloring books check will be sent after all accounts are settled. Zone Chairmen are to remind their clubs to inform the District Governor of purchases so these activities can be monitored. The October membership program resulted in 43 new members. Everyone was reminded of the January/February/March program now in progress and our need to get new members.

NEW BUSINESS:

Lions Clubs International has replaced the International Staff Extension Representative with Territorial Development Managers. There are four managers in the United States. We are in the East Region and our manager is John Aiello. A multiple district membership chairman will be appointed. The District budget might have to include some funds for this program in the future. The International Board is reviewing the possibility of having the Immediate Past District Governor serve as LCIF chairman in the district. The Lieutenant Governor position is also being studied. The program of International Guest Speakers is also being evaluated and some mileage limitations might be established.

The state secretary and state office are being reviewed. Debby Lutz is serving as interim state secretary on a month-to-month basis until decisions are made and the Council appoints a state secretary. Office expenses currently paid by International will be picked up by the State on July 1, 1988.

The clubs with accounts 90 days and older with International are Adell Lions, Oxford Lions and Two Rivers Lioness. The Zone Chairman are to contact these clubs and get these accounts taken care of. All club accounts with International must be within than \$50.00 of the March 31, 1988 balance on June 1, 1988 for the District Governor to qualify for the 100% award. M & A reports for December have not been received from Fairwater, Harrisville and Newton. These are needed in order to prepare the billings for semi-annual dues. Zone Chairman and Deputy District Governors should follow-up on these reports as well as review all M & A reports each month for completeness and accuracy. District Governor visitations must be scheduled so he can get to all clubs this year. Zone Chairman are to be sure to get monthly reports and the Weak Club Status Reports to the District Governor. Copies are to be sent to the State Office and International when required. Committee chairmen should get information to the District Governor for his newsletter.

The Office Expense item in the budget is getting close to the maximum for the year. DDG Pomeroy made a motion to increase this item by \$500.00 to cover expenses for the balance of the year. Seconded by ZC Showers and passed. The billings for the semi-annual dues are in the mail to the clubs.

The committee reports were given by the committee chairmen. The Constitution and By-laws Committee reported that the changes approved at the District Convention have been printed and were distributed today. Zone Chairmen are to distribute them to their Lions and Lioness Clubs. February 19, 1988 is the deadline for changes to be submitted for the State constitution. Diabetes Chairman Kuester reported that clubs are continuing to send contributions and they are appreciated. Let him know if a program is desired by a club. Bowling Chairman Harder reported that the State Bowling Tournament opens on February 6, 1988 at Antigo. The State Bowling Committee is inspecting sites for future tournaments. Fin Chairman Kuehn reported that 2000 District pins have been ordered. He is accepting orders and payment in advance. Cost is \$1.50 per pin for orders of 100 or more and \$1.75 each for less than 100. Drug Awareness Chairman reported on the conference held last week in Milwaukee and on future workshops. \$125.00 was presented to the District by the Vautoma Lions Club for this program. Historian Doede needs a State Directory for 1987-1988 for the 1972-73, and 1973-74. There is a need for biographical data on Past District Governors and other cabinet members so he will be working on this file. ICIF Chairman Koch reported that 3 Melvin Jones Awards are being obtained at the present time. A committee is to be appointed to select the District recipients. Past International Director Eich reported that Lions International was the first service organization to admit women as members.


Leader Dog Chairman Murty reported on his activities. 16 Lions Clubs and 5 Lioness Clubs have contributed so far this year. Leadership and Indoctrination Chairman Kringle is available for member orientation (new and old members). Leadership training will be expanded at the next District Convention. Deputy District Governors should set dates for the leadership and indoctrination training sessions this spring.

Extension Chairmen Seiler and Kitchen reported they are working on Francis Creek Lioness, possibly Elkhart Lake Lioness and North Fond du Lac Lions. Lions Information Chairman Schoenborn will have a protocol article in the District Governor's newsletter which should provide some guidance to clubs and zones. Sight Conservation Chairman Doede reported on the eye bank activities. The Wisconsin Lions Foundation Directors Wood and Schneider reported that \$13,000.00 is available for hearing dogs. 29 clubs have not contributed to the Foundation yet this year. The names of these clubs were reported so the Zone Chairman can contact these clubs. An extension has been built on the dining hall at the camp and paid for by clubs from Stevens Point. A new trading post has also been put up. The lower level of Pinewood Lodge is being finished. The camp still needs operating funds. Youth Exchange Chairman Wodach reported the youth exchange activities and the plans for students. He has three applications for students to go overseas and expects more. Number of host families is not known yet. Would like to see a 50¢ contribution per member for Youth Exchange. District and State Elections Chairman Reiss reported his next duties will be for the State Convention. All committee chairmen reported they are available for zone meetings.

The Deputy District Governors and Zone Chairman gave their reports on clubs in their zones and regions. The past activities and planned activities for the coming months were announced.

The next cabinet meeting will be Sunday, April 17, 1988 at 1:30 p.m. at Mascoutin Golf Club, Berlin. Cabinet pictures will be taken at this meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 5:05 p.m. and the two district reassembled for dinner.

The 12th annual convention of District 27-B1 was opened by District Governor Dwaine Habrat at 9:10 a.m., October 31, 1987 at the Holiday Inn, Fond du Lac, WI. It opened with a prayer by District Chaplain Earl Buchholz, followed by a moment of silence in memory of the Lions who died this past year. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Immediate Past District Governor Dennis Kitchen. Song Leader Earl Buchholz led the singing of the "Lions Spirit" song. A welcome was extended by Jay Messler, Vice President of the Fond du Lac City Council. A welcome was also extended by Joanne Vard, Director of the Fond du Lac Convention Bureau. Lion Russel Schad, President of the Fond du Lac Evening Lions Club - host of the convention, welcomed the delegates and guests.

District Governor Dwaine Habrat introduced the dignitaries and guests. These included the following: International Director Howard Conroy, Past International Director Edward Rick, District Governor Bernie Dahlke, 27-C1 Immediate Past District Governor Dennis Kitchen, Past District Governor, District 27-B1 Past District Governor Harry Merriman, District 27-B2 Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Thomas Thorson, Host Deputy District Governor Charles Pommerening, Deputy District Governors, District 27-B1 Zone Chairman, District 27-B1 District Committee Chairmen Melvin Jones Fellows, Sus Mencl, Bear, Dennis Mencl from Leader Dog, VLF President Jerry Rabbach

District Governor Habrat showed the award received by the Wisconsin Lions from the Association of Wisconsin School Administrators for our contributions to education. District Elections Chairman Glen Reiss explained the convention rules and procedures. Wisconsin Lions Foundation Director Milton Wood, PDG, introduced VLF President Jerry Rabbach who presented the report from the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. International Director Conroy had some remarks and informed the delegates that he was here to listen and answer questions. He was very impressed with the Wisconsin Lions Camp. The District Bowling Awards were presented by Zone Chairman Robert Hautamaki.

PDG Austin Smith placed the name of Deputy District Governor Paul Tadych in nomination for District Governor for 1988-1989. The complete and proper papers for this candidate were submitted before the filing deadline. The second speech was given by PDG Glenn Murty. PDG Haliz made a motion to place Lion Paul Tadych's name on the ballot which was seconded by DCG Voigt and passed. Lion John Sonnenburg placed in the nomination with the Sheboygan Sheboygan as host city for the 1988 District Convention with the Sheboygan Lion Lions Club as the host club. The convention would be held November 4-6, 1988 with the Executive Inn as the convention headquarters. The required papers were submitted prior to the established deadline. The second speech was given by Lion Glen Reiss from the Sheboygan Noon Lions Club. It was approved to place Sheboygan Noon Lions Club on the ballot for the host city for the 1988 convention. PDG Clarence Weller made the nominating speech for Sherwood Lions Club to host the 1988 District Bowling Tournament. The second speech was given by President Ernest Soczka, Jr. of the Sherwood Lions Club. It was approved to place Sherwood on the ballot for hosting the bowling tournament. PDG Austin Smith made a motion to close the nominations for District Governor and host cities for the convention and bowling. The motion was seconded by Zone Chairman Robert Showers and was passed. DCG Tadych made his acceptance speech and announced that his Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer will be Lion Harry Boldt from the Plymouth Lions Club.

District Pin Chairman Roy Kuehn reported that 12 designs were submitted for the District pin. The design for the pin selected in the voting this afternoon will be sent to five companies to get samples and costs. PDG John Coleman, Constitution and By-laws Committee, reported that three resolutions will be voted on this afternoon. These were printed in the District Governor's Newsletter. The resolutions cover the Melvin Jones Award procedures, District Convention requirements and removing the word "male" from the constitution.

District Governor Habrat then introduced District Governor Donald Sykes and his wife, Colleen, from District 27-B2 who are attending our convention.

The Necrology service was then held. It was introduced by Chaplain Earl Buchholz. The first portion was a slide presentation prepared by Lion Bill Harris from the Meshkora Lions Club. The slides showed nature scenes and activities of people in Lions and Lioness Clubs. There was appropriate music and narration as the pictures were shown. This was followed by a devotion service conducted by Rev. James Moore from Our Savior's Lutheran Church of Ripon, Wisconsin. The final portion of the service was the reading of the names of the Lions and Lionesses who died since September, 1986. Representatives from the clubs of the deceased members extinguished candles as the names were read by the District Governor.

The session then adjourned for lunch which was followed by seminar sessions in the afternoon. The seminar topics presented three times in the afternoon were sight conservation, diabetes, LCHF, Leader Dog, club officer development and Lioness.

The convention banquet was at 7:00 p.m. at the Holiday Inn. International Director Conroy addressed the banquet and told us of International activities. He presented a Presidential Certificate to PDG Orvin Doede acknowledging his Lions activities. Gifts were presented to the Conroys by the Fond du Lac Evening Lions, Fond du Lac Lioness Club, and the District, East District Governor Kitchen then presented Melvin James Fellow Awards to Past International Director Edward Eick and Past District Governor Everett Lee. District Elections Chairman Reiss announced the election results. The newly elected District Governor for 1988-1989 is DCG Paul Tadych. Host convention city is Sheboygan and the host bowling city is Sherwood. Pin #9 was selected as the District pin. All three resolutions were approved. After the raffle prizes were distributed Song Leader Earl Buchholz led the singing of "God Bless America". After a closing prayer the banquet adjourned.

The general session resumed at 9:40 a.m. on Sunday, November 1, 1987. After prayer by Chaplain Earl Buchholz, he led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. We then had a critique of the convention. The convention host club was thanked. It was a tremendous convention in one facility with adequate meeting space. The Necrology service was a good idea but the slide presentation was a little long. The convention was a great learning experience. We need to get the new younger Lions to these conventions. In the future, emphasize the Saturday activities for the delegates who come just for the day. It was suggested that maybe a Sunday morning religious service could be arranged. It was suggested that more time be allowed between lunch and the seminars, allow more time to more from one session to another and allow more time for the sessions. Convention chairman Gordon Treiffert thanked everyone for the commitments and will work with the Sheboygan Noon Lions Club next year. He said early registration is important. We had excellent food at the banquet. Registrations totaled 491.

Tall Twister Gordon Rieder reported that \$306.17 was collected over the weekend. \$153.08 will be sent to Leader Dog and \$153.09 will be sent to the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. Leader Dog representative Sue Mencl had some closing remarks and indicated she enjoyed the weekend with us.

International Director Helmer Leicy was welcomed by the delegates to the convention. He brought greetings from Lions International and explained board meeting procedures. He encouraged Lioness Clubs to send in applications for top project awards. Reservations for the International Convention at Denver should be submitted as soon as possible. The extension jobs were eliminated as of November 1, 1987. Four regional employees will be working on extension. There are now 7,000 Melvin James Fellows and working towards the goal of 20,000 fellows.

District Governor-elect Paul Tadych had some remarks about his plans for his year as governor. District Governor Habrat expressed the appreciation of the District for Director Leicy's attendance at our convention. The convention adjourned at 10:40 a.m.

We understand we will not be charged for the tickets sent and we don't have to return them. The State Secretary position will be a full time position and it will be re-advertised in the state magazine. Funding is being worked on and there will be a resolution at the State Convention regarding a multi-year contract. DG Habrat will report further at the April Cabinet meeting.

IPDG Kitchen reported on the International Convention. The State breakfast will cost \$10.00. We will have a hospitality room at the Holiday Inn North in Denver at a cost of \$96 per day. There will not be a Wisconsin reception this year. The Valdars Viking ship will be in the parade. Each district is being asked to provide some financial support. IPDG Kitchen made a motion to authorize \$100.00 from the Miscellaneous account for the Valdars float. Seconded by DDG Voigt and passed. This will be disbursed when needed. Lion Piencikowski reported on the planning for the State Convention in Oshkosh on May 19, 20 and 21, 1988. If housing in the dormitories is not satisfactory, contact the housing bureau. Delegate and alternate cards and advance delegate registration and official credential certificate form were distributed to the zone chairman for distribution to their clubs. These were based on the January M & A reports. Delegates will be determined by membership on April 1, 1988 so adjustments will be made at the April Cabinet meeting or at the time of certification at the convention. Delegate cards for Past District Governors will be distributed later. Tickets for the opening banquet will be provided for cabinet members by the District and will be distributed at the April Cabinet meeting. Cabinet members are to notify the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer no later than March 31, 1988 if they need tickets.

DG Habrat had a request from The M & M Team from Packwaukee asking for the support of the Lions Clubs in the District in putting on puppet shows for schools. Following discussion we declined permission for them to contact the Lions Clubs in the District. DG Habrat will advise of this action.

NEW BUSINESS:

The request to approve a mailing to the clubs in the District for a raffle to expand the UW-Madison Eye Institute was reviewed and discussed. This raffle would be through the Wisconsin Lions Foundation and the amount over \$500,000 would go to the Foundation. It would be called the Home District Raffle for the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. Lion Pommerening made a motion to not endorse a raffle as a fund raiser for expansion of the Madison Eye Institute. Seconded by Lion Champeau and passed by a vote of 11 to 3.

The redistricting resolutions presented to the Constitution and By-laws Committee were reviewed and discussed. The resolution presented by the Council of Governors (#7) would affect Districts B-1, B-2, C-1 and add B-3. District B-1 would consist of the following counties: Marquette, Green Lake, Waushara, Winnebago, Waupaca, Fond du Lac west of Highway 41 and Van Dyne, Portage east of Highway 51, Marathon east of Highway 51 and City of Appleton from Outagamie County.

District B-2 would consist of the following counties: Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Calumet, Kewaunee, Door, Fond du Lac east of Highway 41 except Van Dyne, and Wayside-Morrison from Brown County. District B-3 would consist of the following counties: Shawano, Oconto, Menominee, Langlade, Forest, Florence, Marinette, Outagamie except for the City of Appleton, and Brown except for Wayside-Morrison. District C-1 would consist of the following counties: Adams, Clark, Wood, Portage west of Highway 51 and Marathon west of Highway 51.


Then a resolution was submitted by DG Habrat (#10) which differed from #7 by moving the clubs east of Highway 51 from B-1 to B-3. Final decision to include these resolutions on the ballot will be made at the Council Meeting in March. Following discussion DDG Tadych made a motion to instruct the District Governor to ask the Council to withdraw resolution #7 and if not withdrawn, resolution #10 would be supported by this District. It was suggested that a resolution be drafted to change the State Constitution to have the districts affected vote on the changes before it is voted on at the State Convention.

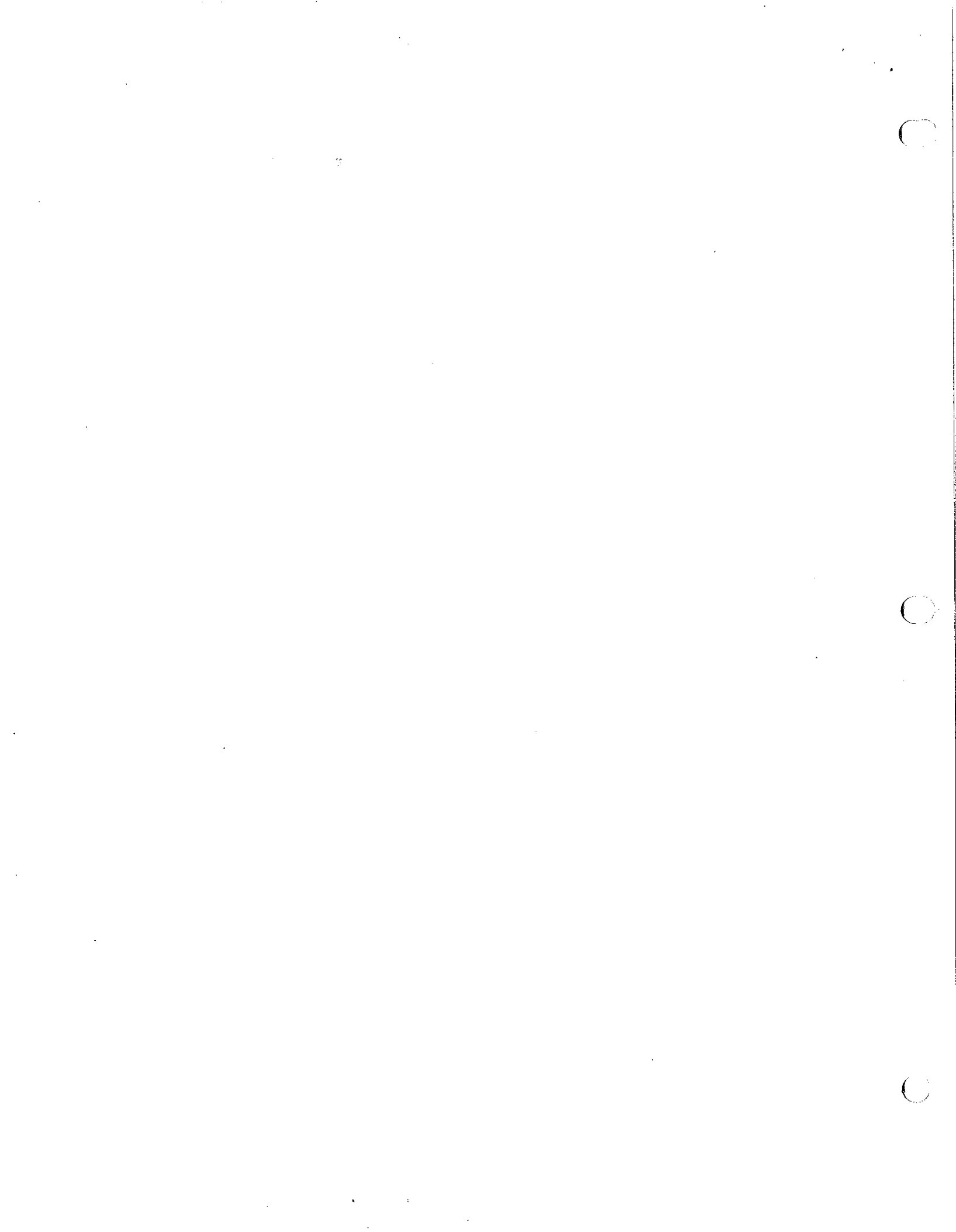

The clubs with past due accounts were announced and Zone Chairmen were instructed to contact these clubs. M & A reports are also to be reviewed and clubs notified when errors or incomplete reports are submitted. Clubs are to be reminded to schedule District Governor visitations if they have not done so. DDG Tadych is working on next year's cabinet so let him know if you are interested in serving. There will be a "Train the Trainer" session at Plover on February 27, 1988. The supply of District pins is presently 400+.

The next cabinet meeting will be Sunday, April 17, 1988 at 1:30 p.m. at Mascoutin Golf Club, Berlin. Cabinet pictures will be taken at this meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 5:05 p.m. after a closing prayer by Chaplain Buchholz.

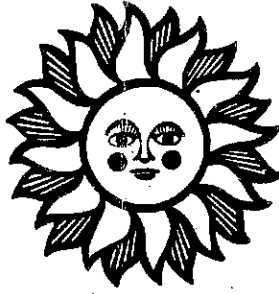

Dear Lions, Lioness and Leos,

Welcome and Happy New Year to all as we begin this 71st year of Lionism! May all your undertakings this year show that indeed "We Serve".

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION WRAP-UP



Actions taken by the International Board of Directors and Delegates to the convention include:

- 1) New Charter Member fees increased from \$15 to \$25.
- 2) Lions transferring to a newly organized Lions Club pay a \$16 Transfer Charter Member fee.
- 3) Regular New Member fee increased from \$15 to \$20.

International Convention host city for 1992 will be Madrid, Spain.

- 5) The following amendment to the Constitution passed which allows women to be invited to become Lions Club members. Thus, a Lions Club may be all men, all women, or men and women. The Lioness Club Program will remain unchanged.

CONSTITUTION

A RESOLUTION TO REMOVE THE WORD "MALE" AS A CONDITION OF MEMBERSHIP IN A LIONS CLUB.

This resolution will provide that a Lions Club would be eligible to invite both male and female persons as members. Thus, membership in a Lions Club will continue to be by invitation only whether a Club is comprised of all men, all women, or men and women.

Shall the following resolution be adopted?

BE IT RESOLVED, That, Article III, Section 8, of the International Constitution be amended by deleting the word "male" as it appears in Line 2 of said Section and that a new sentence be added to the end of said Section to read as follows:

"Wherever the male gender or pronoun presently appears in the International Constitution and By-Laws, it shall be interpreted to mean both male and female persons."

Our own Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Tom Thorson was asked to serve on the International Elections Committee during the convention and assisted voters during the balloting. Ask him to tell you about it.

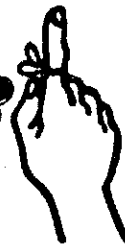

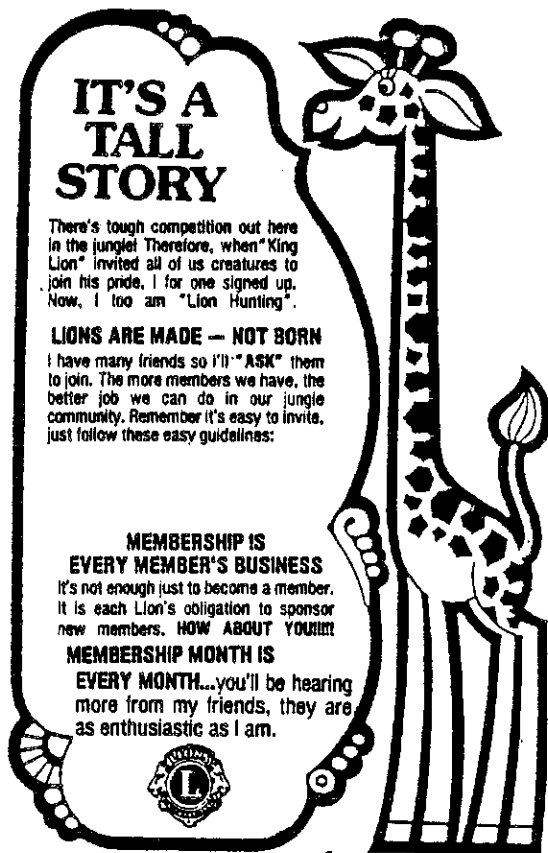

CLUB SECRETARY'S NOTE PAD

100% Secretary's Award Requirements for 1987-88:

1) Membership and Attendance Reports (M&A) must be received no later than the fifth of the month following the month for which the report is made. Copies are sent to Lions International, District Governor, Deputy District Governor and Zone Chairman.

2) All District dues, all International dues, and all club supply billings be given to club officers for payment within 10 days of receipt. Payment must be made within 30 days of receipt of billing.

3) There must be no club indebtedness owed to Lions International or the District which would make club delegates ineligible to vote at the District, State or International Conventions. All District and International dues must be paid by March 31, 1988.

4) The PU-101 forms (one for the District Governor and one for Lions International) must be properly filled out showing the newly elected President, Secretary and Treasurer and submitted no later than April 30, 1988 to Lions International and the District Governor.

5) All delegate forms must be submitted by May 1, 1988 for the State Convention.

6) The Secretary must attend at least 2 Zone meetings held in his zone during the current year, 1987-88.

7) The Club Secretary must be recommended for the award by his President and either his Zone Chairman or Deputy District Governor. Final

approval will be by the District Governor.

8) Any of the above rules may be waived by the District Governor if he is advised of conditions which exist beyond the control of the Secretary.

9) Applications for this award must be submitted to the District Governor no later than July 8, 1988.

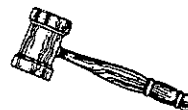

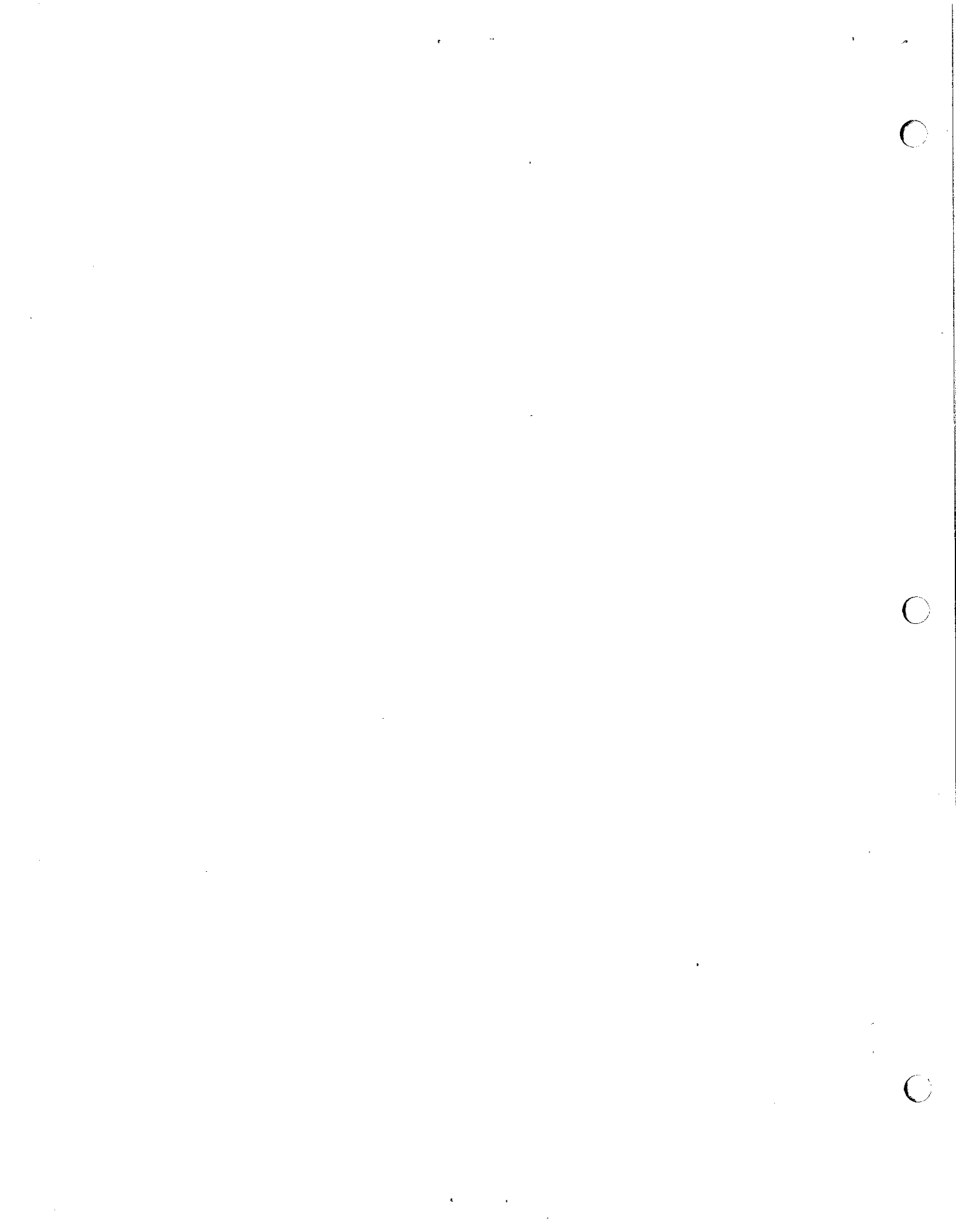

Solving Your Club's Problems

The top priority for you as Club President is to solve any existing problems your club may have. Accomplishing this will help you achieve your goals and have a successful year in Lionism.

1. Call Meeting to Discuss Problems of Club

Make a special effort to get all members in attendance. Call each member and tell them the importance of this meeting.

2. Divide Club Into Small Discussion Groups

If your club membership is: 10-30 = 5 to 6 people per table
31-40 = 6 to 8
50 or more = 8 to 10

3. Select a Discussion Leader

Each group requires a discussion leader whose job is to see that each member has input into the discussion.

4. Select a Recorder

It is the recorder's job to make sure the points identified are written down.

5. Explain the Format

Each group is given 15-30 minutes (an average of 3 minutes per person) depending on the need to discuss the question: "What's Wrong With Our Club?"

6. Feedback

Ask the discussion leaders to give you 4 or 5 of the problems his/her group came up with. The purpose of this session is to get all the information back from the group in a format that will allow it to be shared and experienced by the entire larger group.

7. Form Committee to Categorize

Once you have recorded all of the problems the membership has come up with, you must form a committee to categorize these problems.

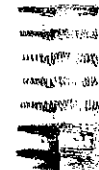
8. Form Committee to Solve

It will be the responsibility of the committee to study and form solutions that the club may use to solve the problems. It is important for the club officers to then make the necessary changes to accommodate each and every member in the club.

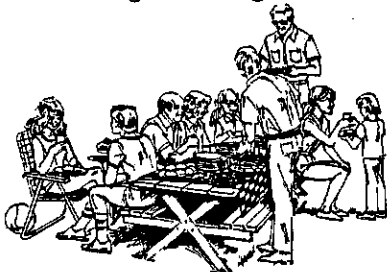

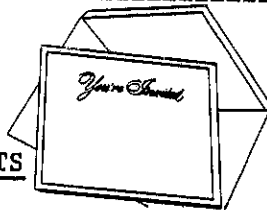
Club President:

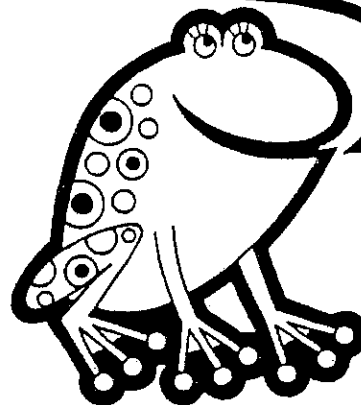

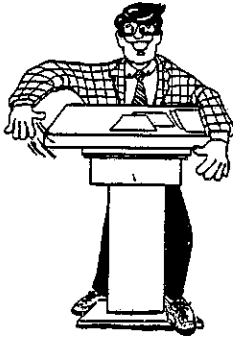

Even though it was not established as a separate District until 1967, the members and clubs of District 27-B1, as it is presently constituted, have been in the forefront of Lionism since it's establishment in Wisconsin on June 22, 1921.

The parent Lions Club in Wisconsin is that which is now known as the Milwaukee Central, organized on June 22, 1921. At a special District Convention held in Decatur, Illinois on May 22, 1922, the Rev. J. A. Holmes, of the Appleton Lions Club, was elected the first District Governor. In Madison, at the first Wisconsin Lions State Convention, on May 15 and 16, 1923, he was elected for a second term, and also elected to serve as a member of the Executive Council of the Board of Governors of Lions International. At this first State Convention, 15 clubs were represented. Included were Appleton, Fond du Lac, Manitowoc, Sheboygan and Two Rivers from what is now District 27-B1.

The second State Convention was held in Green Bay on May 26 and 27, 1924 with 19 out of 20 clubs represented. The third State Convention was in Fond du Lac on May 26 and 27, 1925 with all 19 clubs represented.

In 1938 Wisconsin was re-districted into three districts, 27-A, 27-B and 27-C. The first convention under the new alignment was held in Menasha in 1939. At that time, the state had 113 clubs with 2,974 members. The fourth district, 27-D was added in 1940 and the fifth district, 27-E was established in 1950 during the State Convention in Wausau.

During the State Convention in West Allis in 1967, District 27-B was divided into two districts, 27-B1 and 27-B2. Howard Heimke of the Brillion Lions Club was the first District Governor of the present District 27-B1.

District wide projects included CARE and Youth Exchange in addition to the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. CARE Chairman was Merlin Feind, Youth Exchange Chairman was Pat Harder and the Directors of the Wisconsin Lions Foundation were Herb Schneider, George Welch and Austin Smith.

District 27-B1 hosted the State Lions Convention at Appleton in 1972 and Oshkosh in 1979. The 1988 State Convention will also be held in Oshkosh.

The first District Convention was held in Fond du Lac on October 22, 23 and 24, 1976. This was also the first district convention in the State of Wisconsin which is identified as Lions Multiple District 27. The Twelfth District Convention for District 27-B1 will be held in Fond du Lac on October 30 and 31 and November 1, 1987. The District has adopted a comprehensive constitution and by-laws and now elects it's District Governor and Wisconsin Lions Foundation Directors at the district convention.

District 27-B1 now has 75 Lions Clubs with over 2,900 members, 21 Lioness Clubs with over 560 members and 2 Leo Clubs.

Membership Development and Retention, Leadership and Indoctrination and Extension are all given constant attention in our District. Our District Governor has appointed enthusiastic and well qualified Lions as District Chairmen for each and they have laid out well developed programs which will be promoted throughout the year.

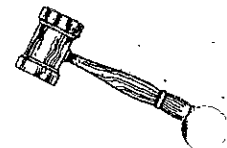

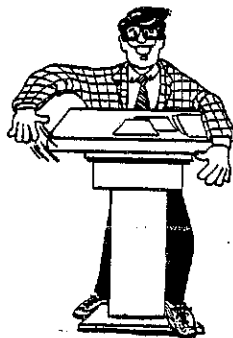

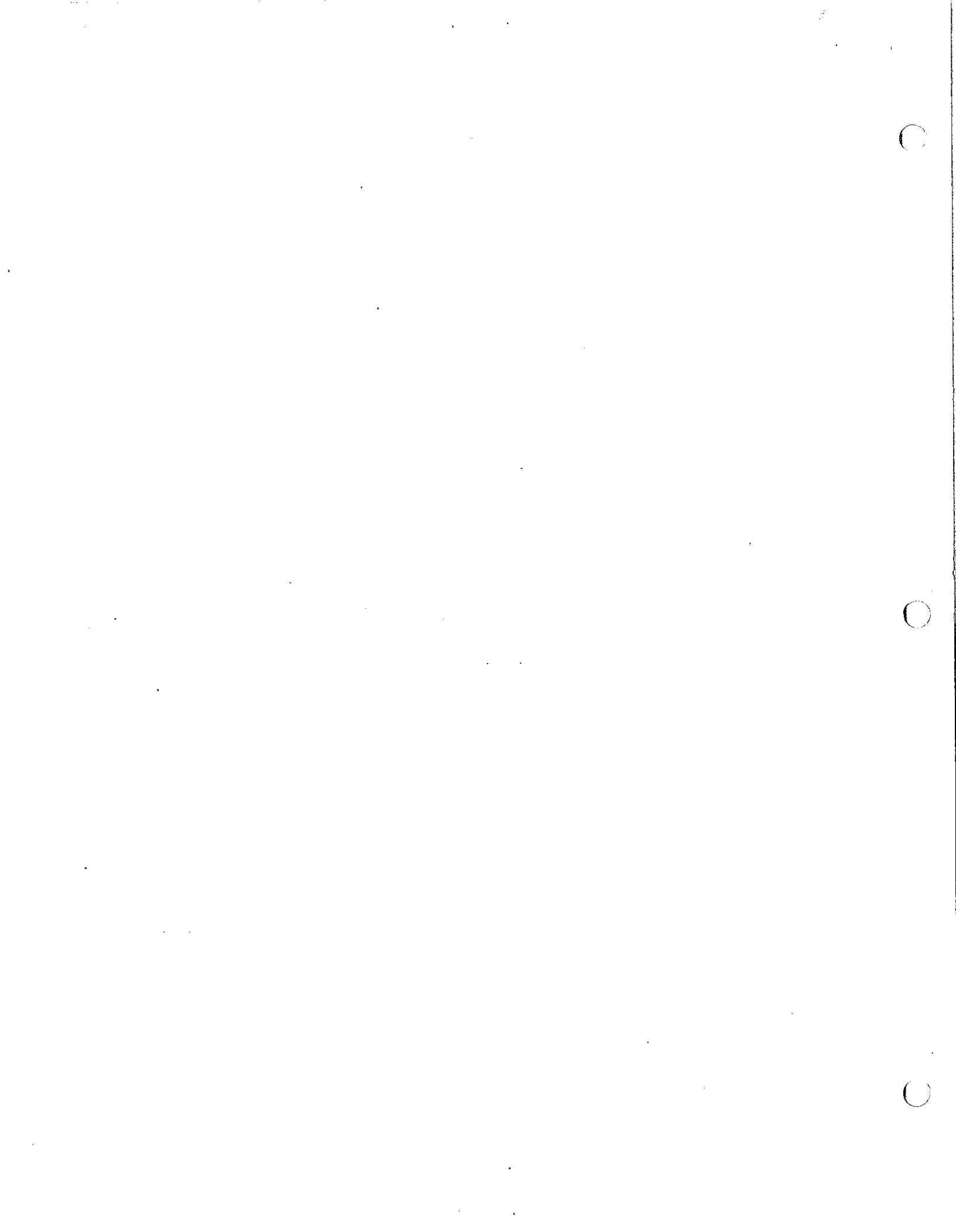

RESOLUTION NUMBER 1

WHEREAS Past International Directors suggested we have districts go together to select Melvin Jones Fellowship, and

WHEREAS Past District Governor Dennis Kitchen appointed a committee to come up with guidelines for the district to equitably select Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards from District 27B-1, and

WHEREAS this committee has come up with a list of guidelines

THEREFORE, be it resolved that in Article III, Section 8 of the By-Laws will be the following:

MELVIN JONES COMMITTEE

1. A Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards Committee will consist of six governor appointed cabinet members - six will be appointed by the district governor in 1987-88 - three will be appointed for a one year term and three will be appointed for a two year term. Each year thereafter the district governor will change three members on this committee.
2. The district governor will serve as an ex-officio non-voting member of the committee. He will vote only to break a tie.
3. The chairman of the Melvin Jones Fellowship Committee will be voted on at the first committee meeting.
4. The LCIF chairman will serve as a resource person to the Melvin Jones Fellowship Committee and keep the committee informed of the money donated to the District LCIF fund.
5. The cabinet secretary will continue to handle all funds donated to LCIF.
6. The yearly awards will be based on the money donated by district to the LCIF fund from July 1 to June 30 - the lionistic year.
7. The Melvin Jones Fellowship Committee will meet after the first Cabinet Meeting each year. The 1987-88 year they will meet after District Convention. At this meeting, they will determine who will receive the current year's Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards.
8. The Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards will be officially presented at District Convention's evening banquet following the fiscal year the monies were collected.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2

A resolution that provides the guidelines for the District Convention and delineates the responsibilities, requirements, rules, and procedures for hosting the convention.

WHEREAS the District 27B-1 District Constitution provides for an annual District Convention in Article VI, and

WHEREAS Article VIII provides for a District Convention fund, and

WHEREAS District 27B-1 has now had eleven years experience in holding a District Convention and there is a need to set up guidelines for this event.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the first two sentences of Article VIII, Section 1 of the Constitution be stricken and rewritten as follows:

The District shall not be responsible for any expense incurred by the host club in sponsoring The District Convention except those mentioned in Article IV, Section 5 of the By-Laws. All other expenses and losses shall be the full obligation of the Host Club.

ALSO: BE IT RESOLVED that Section 3, Article VIII of the Constitution be stricken and Section 4, Article VIII of the Constitution be renumbered 3.

ALSO: BE IT RESOLVED that Article IV of the District 27B-1 By-laws be stricken and rewritten as follows:

ARTICLE IV

DISTRICT CONVENTION PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES

Section 1.

The District Governor shall arrange the Order of Business for the District Convention, and the same shall be the order of the day for all sessions.

Section 2.

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Constitution and By-Laws, or in the Rules of Procedure adopted for a meeting, all questions of Order and Procedure in any District meeting or convention, any meeting of the District Cabinet, a Region, Zone, or Member Club or of any group or committee of any one of them shall be determined by Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised.

Resolution 2
Page 2

Section 3.

Host Club requirements:

a. Club must be in good standing and meet all the requirements listed in Article VI, Sections 1, 2, and 3, of the District 27B-1 Constitution.

b. The host club shall have at least 110 rooms available for housing and be able to provide adequate meeting rooms and banquet facilities.

Section 4.

Host Club responsibilities:

a. Reserve up to eight (8) rooms for dignitaries: District Governor, District Cabinet Secretary, Convention Liaison, District Past International Director, Keynote Speaker.

b. Host club will set the date of the District Convention and get approval from the District Governor.

c. Host club will handle all registration and promotion of convention.

d. Host club will provide refreshments, flowers and gifts for keynote speaker under the direction of the District Governor.

e. Host club may charge a registration fee up to \$3 for each Lion and \$1.50 for each non-Lion (Lioness, spouses, Leos, and guests), subject to approval of District Governor. This fee will be to help offset the cost of Convention Seminar Speakers.

f. Host club will provide space and entertainment for a hospitality event on Friday evening.

g. Host club will provide adequate space for meetings and seminars.

h. Host club will provide for the Saturday noon luncheon, Saturday night sit-down banquet and Sunday morning brunch and will be responsible for the selling of said tickets.

i. Host club will provide space and table(s) for pin traders.

Section 5.

Guidelines for the District Responsibilities
(District Convention Liaison)

- a. The District and the District Convention Liaison will arrange for the Saturday night keynote speaker and the seminar presenters.
- b. The District and the District Convention Liaison will act as host to visiting dignitaries.
- c. The District and the District Convention Liaison will provide transportation for the keynote speaker.
- d. The District and the District Convention Liaison will invite the past and present Wisconsin International dignitaries at their own expense.
- e. The District will cover all the expenses of the convention keynote speaker that are not covered by International rules of audit.
- f. The District will cover the expenses for a Friday evening dinner to entertain the keynote speaker along with other dignitaries approved by the District Governor.

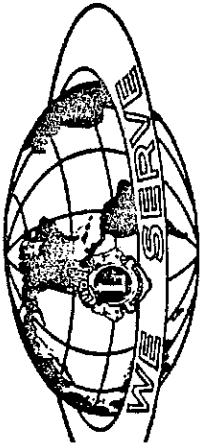
Do you present any of your outgoing Club Officers with a Past Officer Tabs for their vest?

FROM YOUR DISTRICT 27-B1 SIGHT CONSERVATION CHAIRMAN:

Sight conservation and work with the blind has been a major project of Lionism since the 1925 International Convention when Helen Keller challenged Lions to become "KNIGHTS OF THE BLIND." There are millions of visually impaired people in the world and our work in this field is desperately needed.

Sight conservation and work with the blind encompasses a broad range of service activities including Diabetes Projects, Eye Banks, Examination and Detection, Leader Dogs for the Blind, Wisconsin Lions Camp and Eye Research. It also includes services to the partially sighted such as new eye glasses for the needy, large print books and magazines, white canes, braille writers, talking books and the collection of used eye glasses; plus a broad range of other services and activities.

Leader Dog Chairman, Glenn Murty can provide information about the Leader Dog program. Diabetes Chairman John Kuester is available for assistance in Diabetes related projects. Wisconsin Lions Foundation Directors Milt Wood and Herb Schneider will help with information and applications for the Wisconsin Lions Camp.

There is a great deal of information and data available on the other aspects of sight conservation and work with the blind. I am available to attend Board meetings, Club meetings and Zone meetings to discuss and help with your concerns in this field.

~~The branch eye banks in our District have done a great job in providing a record number of eyes to the Wisconsin Eye Bank in Madison and the Wisconsin Lions Eye Bank in Milwaukee. However, the need is still not being met. Both eye banks have long waiting lists for corneal transplants and the both have shortages of eyes for vital research.~~

Dr. Michael Shapiro of the Wisconsin Eye Bank advises: "People who have had cataracts and who have had lens implants can be eye donors and their gifts are extremely valuable in providing sight". A research project currently underway is studying the long term effects of intraocular lens implants. Diabetic Retinopathy research, glaucoma research and evaluations of new drugs are a few of the many other promising programs which are affected by the shortage of donor eyes.

Dr. Shapiro adds: "An eye donation for corneal transplant can give sight to two individuals. But an eye donation for research may help give sight to literally hundreds of people."

Yes, there continues to be an urgent need for the donation of eyes for corneal transplantation and for research. We Lions must tell this to hospital personnel and others who approach families about eye donations.

TO: Non-profit Organizations Who Use "Beer Picnic Licenses"

RE: AB 39--Which would create a new provision that applies when alcohol beverages are furnished pursuant to a license authorizing the sale of fermented malt beverages at a fair, picnic or similar gathering, often called a picnic beer license. In that situation civil liability based on illegally serving alcohol beverages to an underage person may only be imposed on the person directly furnishing the beverages, not on any other person or the group sponsoring the event

If this became law, insurance costs would drop drastically to almost nothing in cost.

A copy of AB 39 is enclosed for your review plus three supporting letters selected at random. Plus the Wisconsin State Firefighters, Fire Chiefs, VFW Posts, Lions Clubs, etc., have shown support.

Representative John Schober intends to introduce AB 39 as a state budget amendment to AB 850. The Excise and Fees Committee chairperson has refused to act on AB 39 so the only way to get this proposal before the legislature is through a state budget amendment.

If you support AB 39 and wish to have it attached to AB 850, please call your state senator and state representative and let them know of such support. The Legislative Hotline Number is 1-800-362-9696, toll free, or write them.

Please pass this letter on to other members of your organizations. Get it out statewide as soon as possible. Assembly Bill 850 will be acted upon in mid-March. When contacting your legislator (senator or representative) simply state:

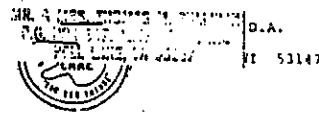

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law provides that a person is immune from civil liability arising out of furnishing alcohol beverages to another person with certain exceptions. A person who furnishes alcohol beverages to an underage person in violation of the statutes who knows or should know that the underage person is under the legal drinking age is not immune from civil liability.

This bill creates a new provision that applies when alcohol beverages are furnished pursuant to a license authorizing the sale of fermented malt beverages at a fair, picnic or similar gathering, often called a picnic beer license. In that situation, civil liability based on illegally serving alcohol beverages to an underage person may only be imposed on the person directly furnishing the beverages, not on any other person or the group sponsoring the event.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 SECTION 1. 125.035 (4) (c) of the statutes is created to read:
5 125.035 (4) (c) If the alcohol beverages are procured, sold, dis-

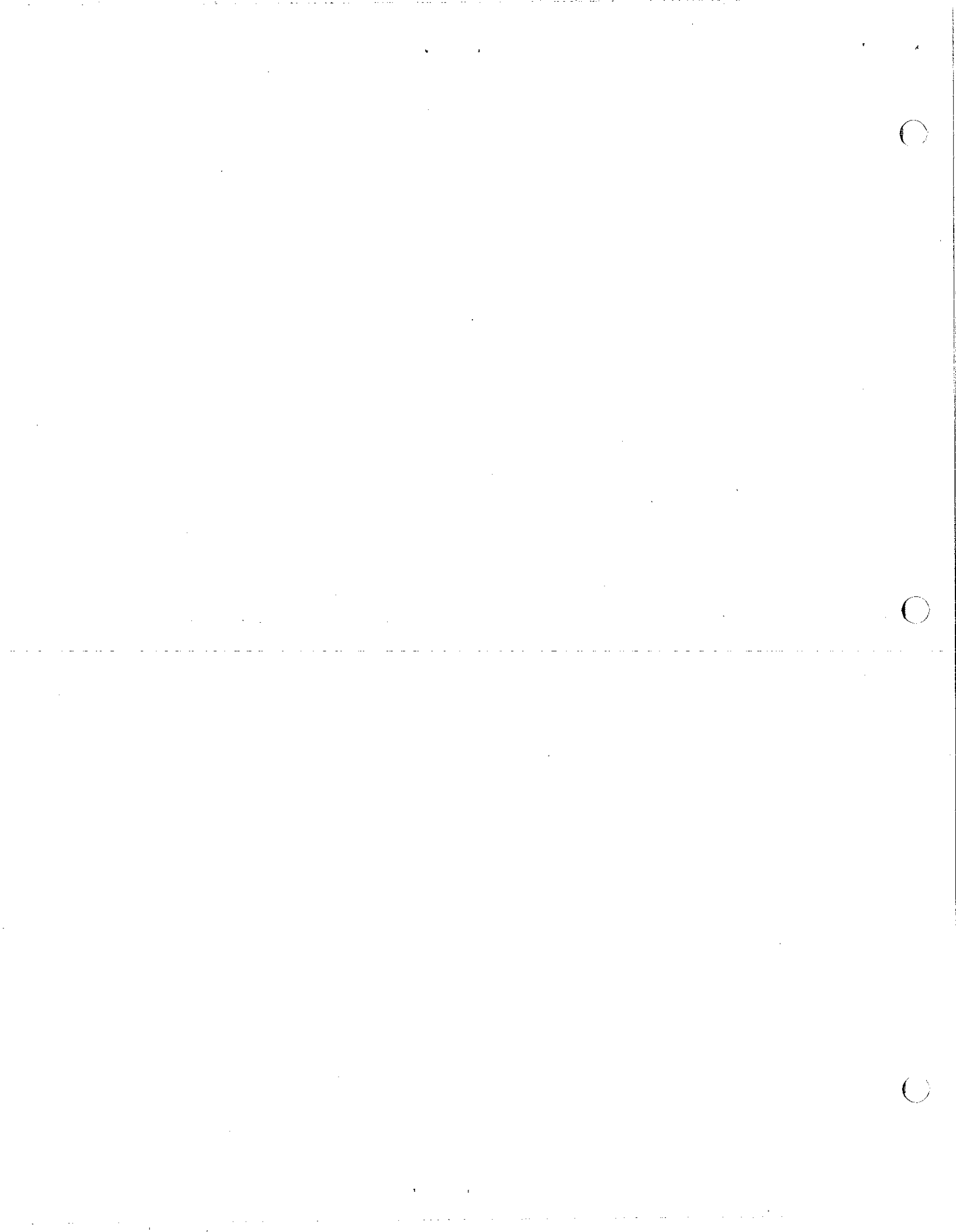

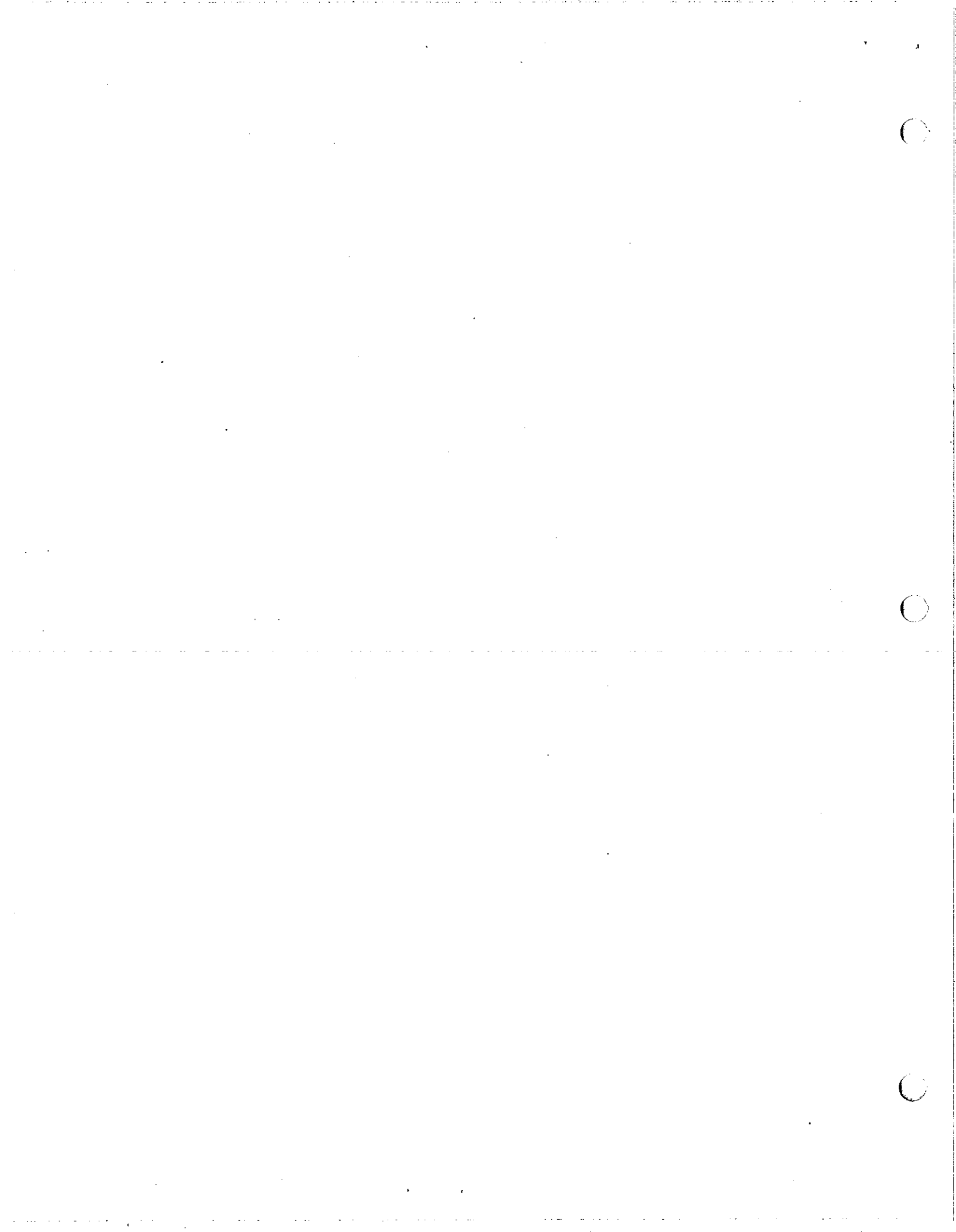

The 1987-88 application is enclosed; it should be forwarded by the club secretary with the June M&A Report. The signature of the district governor and the deputy district governor or zone chairman must be included before mailing the application to International Headquarters.
