Bowling Chairman, Glen Murty, gave report on the past State Bowling Tournament.

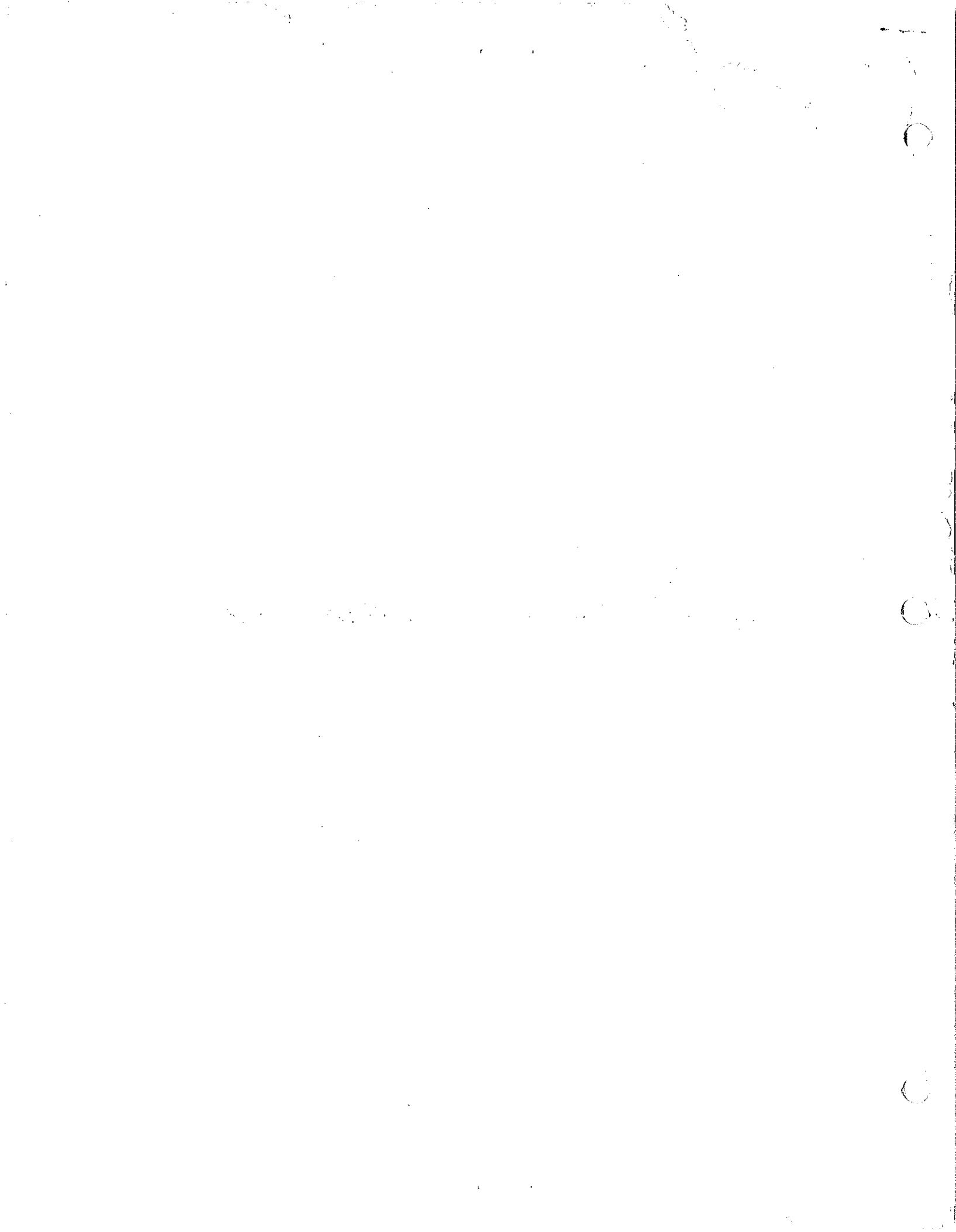

Deputy District Governors and Zone Chairmen gave their reports:

Leadership & Indoctrination Chairman, Donald Kringel reported on Leadership Seminars and again emphasized that all incoming Club Presidents and Secretaries should attend. He stated he is willing to attend club functions and speak on retention and orientation.

Membership Development & Retention Chairman, Max Harrington, stated that retention is the important part of membership. He reports that we are getting new members but we are also losing too many members.

Sight Conservation & Leader Dog Chairman, Vernon F. Pautz, discussed the transfer of a member from one club to another, discussion followed. He also stated that our District received two dogs this year and one pending. Thirty six Clubs have donated \$5,968.50, including Lioness & Leo Clubs the total donated to Leader Dog is \$6,719.75. Eye Sight Program: he hasn't received any communications from the eye bank.

Lion & Lioness Extension region 1 & 2 Chairman, James Seiler, reports on a new Lion's Club in the Cedar Grove area and a new Lioness Club at Frances Creek.

Hearing & Speech Chairman, Gordon Hoffman, had a referral for a hearing dog but the party did not qualify. He has received donations from 16 Lion, Lioness & Leo Clubs totaling \$1,470.00 in our district this year.

Membership Development, Retention chairman, Max Harrington, stated that the membership seems like a revolving door. Discussion followed on ways to attract new members and retain present members.

Sight Conservation and Leader Dog Chairman, Vernon Pautz, reported that some of the Clubs are slow in their donations. He states that as far as the Sight program is concerned he is in the dark. He writes to them and receives no replies. Discussion followed.

Hearing & Speech Chairman, Gordon Hoffman, gave a report on donations received from various clubs.

Zone Chairman, Paul Tadych, gave a report for Lion & Lioness Extention Chairman, James Seiler, who was excused, he states that by April there is a possibility of an additional Lioness Club.

Lion & Lioness Chairman, Milt Wood, reported two new Lioness Clubs have been formed.

Leadership & Indoctrination Chairman, Donald Kringel, reported that all Presidents & Secretary-Treasurers should attend leadership seminars for more successful clubs. Seminars will be held this spring, he also spoke on orientation.

Meeting adjourned at 4:35 P.M.

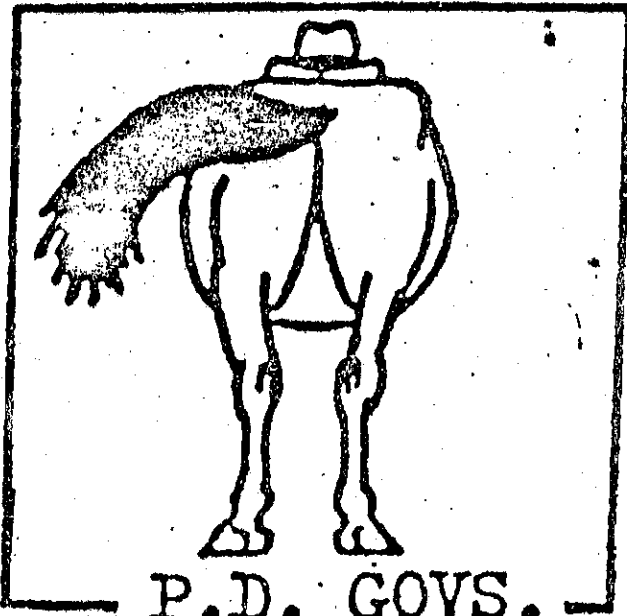

4. The PU 101 form must be properly filled out showing the newly elected President, Secretary and Treasurer, meeting time and place. This form must be in no later than April 30, 1987, send to Lions International and the District Governor.
5. All delegate forms and cards must be completed and Submitted by May 1 for the State Convention.
6. The Secretary must attend at least 2 Zone meetings held in his Zone during the current year.
7. The Club Secretary must be recommended for the award by either his Deputy District Governor or Zone Chairman, with final approval by the District Governor.
8. Any of the above Rules may be waived by the District Governor if he is advised of conditions which exist beyond the control of the Secretary.
9. Application for this Award must be Submitted to the District Governor no Later than July 5, 1987

Dear Club Members:

This year, District Governor Kitchen has appointed me to serve as LCIF Chairman for our District.

Lions Clubs International Foundation is one of the most vital parts of our Lions organization. Since its inception in 1968, LCIF has helped support hundreds of ambitious Lion projects, ranging from creating eye banks, to teaching employable skills to the disabled, to rebuilding communities in the wake of natural disasters. Through the LCIF donations made by clubs and individual Lions, LCIF has actually made positive changes in millions of lives.

When a devastating earthquake struck Mexico, LCIF responded immediately with a grant of \$50,000. When a volcanic eruption in Columbia swallowed entire towns and claimed tens of thousands of lives, LCIF was there again, with another grant of \$50,000.

LCIF has also become a leader in the Lions' fight against diabetes-related blindness. The Foundation has granted over \$1,000,000 to help scientists in their search for the causes and cures of diabetic retinopathy. In 1985 \$90,000 of that went to scientists right here in Wisconsin.

In 1983-84 \$30,000 was received by the Wisconsin Lions Foundation to help with the sanitation system at the camp in Rosholt, \$4,000 was given for tornado relief in District B2, and another \$25,000 was given to replace a firetruck destroyed by the tornado that hit Barneveld.

I'm sure you'll agree that these are great accomplishments. None of them would have been possible though, if it were not for the generous LCIF contributions of Lions who look beyond the needs of their own communities to the needs of our entire world family. Think of what we would achieve if all Lions worked even harder to make our Foundation strong.

As an individual you can make a donation of \$10 making you a Contributing Member; \$100 puts your name on the LCIF Honor Roll; and a donation of \$1,000 would make you a Melvin Jones Fellow. The Melvin Jones Fellowship is the highest honor bestowed by LCIF.

As a club you can also honor an individual with the Melvin Jones Fellowship by contributing \$1,000 and designating a Lion, perhaps a Past President or long-time member of your club, or an outstanding citizen of your community. If you wish, you can contribute \$200 per year for 5 years if you cannot afford the entire \$1,000 at one time. This is an excellent way to honor someone in your community and also aid the many important programs of LCIF.

This year, LCIF Week is scheduled for the week of January 11 through 17, 1987. Lions around the world will be celebrating the Tuesday of that week, January 13, as Melvin Jones Fellows Day. This would be an excellent time for your club to name a Melvin Jones recipient in your club or community.

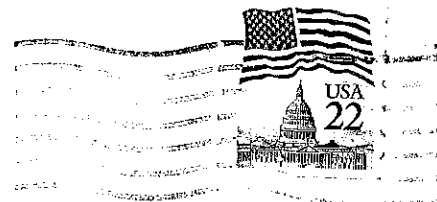

If you do not receive your copies please contact me I will see that you get your forms.

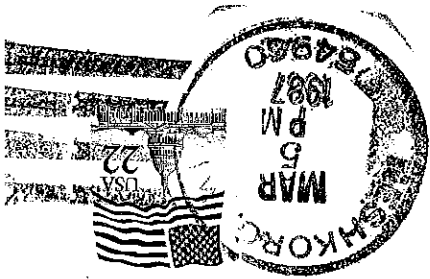
Remember your club is only as good as your officers. If you have good strong officers your club will be Strong and Healthy. Printed below are some guidelines sent out by International office.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A LEADER

What are the qualities we look for in a leader? If you are ever responsible for appointing or developing a leader in your Club, here are some helpful guidelines:

1. Look hard at the Lions' potential. Don't discount a man's qualifications simply because you have never seen him perform as a leader. Remember, leadership skills can be learned.
2. In Lionism, the most important qualification for leadership is that the man's heart is right with Lionism and with his Club members. Ask yourself:
 - Does this Lion seek out and enjoy fellowship with the Club members?
 - Has he ever become excited about a service project? Excited about doing the right thing for the community and his fellow Club members?
 - Does he take directions without resistance or resentment? Once he is a leader, would he still take advice.?
 - Is his nature such that he enjoys serving others, especially his fellow Club members? Would he lead by example?
3. Is he doing things to "grow" or become a better Lion or human being?
4. Is he personable and well groomed? Remember, your leaders represent your Club to the community, to people who don't know them as well as you do.
5. Do you believe he can or can learn to delegate tasks, to be decisive and persistent?

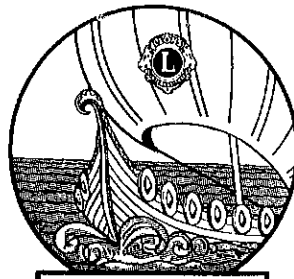

Council of Governors; Disapproves.
My Comments;; This reolution was brought forward because they are afraid of a large votion block. I think if the P.D.G.s ever agree on a single item it must be for the good of the Wisconsin Lions. They con not agree on anything else.

Resolution 2; You will vote on 2a or 2b..

2a. requires council of Governors to select the chairman from the Immediate Past District Governors.

Council of Governors; Disapproves

2b. Requires Council Chairman to be from District hosting State Convention that Year.

Council of Governors; Disapproves

My Comments on 2a and 2b. Both systems have been tried before and changed back to the way we have now I see no problem with it the way it is.

Resolution 3; Formally establishes the State Youth Exchange Committee.

Council of Governors; Approves

My comments; It is about time this happens.

As it is now Youth exchange is not recognized in the Constitution.

Resolution 4; You will vote on 4a or 4b

4a; Assures proper accounting for State Funds by Council hiring an indipendent CPA firm.

Council of Governors; Approves

My comments; Because of the amount of money handled by the state office, and the complexity of tax laws, this is the proper way to do this.

4b; Gives the power to hire the Auditing firm to the present Audit committe.

Council of Governors; Disapproves.

Resolution 5; Insures that all Lions are aware of resolutions needing 2/3 majority vote to pass, by providing a footnote below the resolution on the ballot.
Council of Governors; Approves
My Comments.; After the problem last year. good idea

Resolution 6; Assures that Wisconsin International Director candidates actively seek office each year. If the candidate removes his name from the international ballot, He would have to run again for state support.
Council of Governors; Disapproves
My Comments; If this were done this way Wisconsin would never have an International Director. Most Directors need 2 years campaigning to get on the International Board.

Resolution 7; Establishes the location of the State Lions office at Lions Camp with Relocation being within 3 Years.
Council of Governors; Disapproves
My comments; This resolution is not a timely one. The office we now have is rented cheaper than we could operate our own building. Also if we were to move the office, our office secretary would quit, her wages are shared by International, the State Lion and The Wisconsin Lions Foundation, International pays 80% of her wages, The International office will not pay for a replacement.

Resolution 8; Congatulates Portage County Lions for Hosting State Convention.
Council of Governors; Approves

Resolution 9; Thanks International President Sten Akestam for attending the State Convention.
Council of Governors; Approves
